An interesting overstruck coin of Constantinus I

There is an interesting overstruck follis preserved in the numismatic collection of the Husite Museum in Tábor. It was not possible to attribute and date positively the original die produced in the Londonium mint. Only two coins of 313–314 or five coins of 317 have been identified as related by a process of elimination. The die overstriking the original coin has been identified precisely – it was produced in the Trier mint in 321. The coin represents accidentally preserved evidence for withdrawing of older issues from circulation in order of their overstriking. It is only possible to speculate about the reasons which led to the use of an older coin as a flan for another issue.
