Deniers struck under the Duchess Emma from finds preserved in German public collections

There are two deniers struck under wife of the Bohemian Duke Boleslaus II (972–999) – Emma († 1006) in Mělník preserved in the Niedersächsisches Landesmuseum in Hannover. They were described by E. Fiala in his list of the numismatic collection of the Royal Numismatic Cabinet in Hannover in 1910. The first specimen comes from the Ołobok hoard (Ostrowski district, Great Poland) buried sometimes after 1000 and found in 1889. The other specimen comes from a hoard containing coins and jewels which was buried after 995 and found in Čistěves (Hradec Králové district, east Bohemia) in 1896. Some six deniers struck under the Duchess Emma are preserved in the coin cabinet of the Staatliche Museen in Berlin. Four of them surely come from the large hoard of coins and jewels which was buried after 1003 and found in Bystrzyca (Oławski district, Lower Silesia) in 1886. The remaining two pieces were donated to the Berlin coin cabinet by the famous German numismatist Hermann Dannenberg (1824–1905), but their finding specifications are unknown. There is one denier of Emma Regina preserved in the numismatic collection of the Staatliche Kunstsammlungen in Dresden, but its finding specifications or origin are not known.
