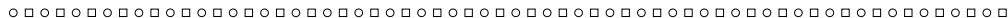

## ***Contribution to activities of the Bavarian die-engravers in the Prague mint in the 970s and 980s***

*The direct presence of the Bavarian die-engravers in the Prague mint in the first half of the 970s is illustrated via iconographical connection of the oldest Bohemian deniers with the Bavarian prototypes and also via several mistakes in marginal legends, where the names of the Bavarian rulers or some Bavarian mints appeared in the case of several Bohemian deniers. Similar situation is detectable in the case of some varieties of the later deniers struck in the Prague mint during the first half of the 980s. These deniers have their marginal legends and composition of letters below chapel evidently connected with the Bavarian mint in Regensburg. The first denier is of the broad hand/ chapel type, and the second denier is of the sword type (C 55). Both examples confirm presence of the Bavarian die-engravers in the Prague mint in the first half of the 980s and their cooperation during production of the deniers. But their iconography does not copy the Bavarian prototypes.*
