Remarks about the coinage of Emperor and King Franz II/I (1792–1835)

The turbulent political history during the rule of Emperor and King Franz II/I (1792–1835) was reflected also in the financial sphere. Especially the war years bring new information about the contemporary coinage. In the article, the following phenomena are presented: extraordinary pieces, interesting and hybrid coins, underestimated overstrikes, production technologies and new emissions. The first part is dedicated to the coins struck in the Prague mint after its re-opening in 1795, particularly to the interesting half thaler produced in the same year. The second part is focused on underestimated overstrikes struck under Emperor Franz II. The third section describes interesting coins in context of the first decade of the 19th century. The fourth part presents copper coins produced after the state bankruptcy in 1811, and the fifth section is concentrated on the very beginning of the more stable monetary history.
