***Unknown double-sided coin struck under Wenceslas II
with inscription of WENZLA (or WENZLE)***

A new type of the double-sided coin of Wenceslas II is presented. Three pieces were reportedly found together with other coins in the ruins of an unspecified castle somewhere in the Brno region. Some parvi of the 14th century were also discovered there – but it is impossible to prove that they all belonged to one group. It is not clear if the mentioned coin was a denier or an obolus. It was surely struck under Wenceslas II, in 1283–1300 most likely. It is the very first double-sided coin of this ruler. Provenance of the coin is unclear, it could be the Bohemian and also the Moravian issue. The coin interestingly enriches information about the coinage of Wenceslas II.
