## Overstruck Bohemian deniers from the Gębice [Karlsdorf] find. Contribution to inner chronology of the oldest varieties of the deniers of the later Bavarian-Swabian type and the deniers of the broad band type II

In 2007, based on identification of the overstruck coins from the Podebrady find, the authors tried to classify the chronological sequence of the oldest varieties of the deniers of the later Bavarian-Swabian type and the deniers of the broad hand type (Numismatický sborník 22, 2007, pp. 39–90). In 2008 and 2009, they studied one part of the Bohemian section of the find of deniers from Silesian Gebice [Karlsdorf] in the collection of the Staatliche Museen in Berlin in order to test their chronological construction. The find was buried some time after 985 and discovered in 1939 – some 616 complete coins were preserved and described, plus over one hundred coin fragments and fragments of silver jewels. Via detailed research, traces of overstriking were found in case of eight deniers. Coins of the first group represented by four deniers of the broad hand/chapel type (Cach no. 29) – one unknown variety of this type inclusive – were struck on various types of deniers: an unspecified cross/chapel type (possibly a Bavarian one); types registered by Cach under nos. 26 and 32; an unknown Bohemian variety of the cross/chapel type. Coins of the second group represented also by four deniers of the later Bavarian-Swabian type (Cach no. 32) were exclusively overstruck on different specimens of the same type. Results of the analysis confirmed the existing chronological construction and enlarged it with additional types of the Bohemian deniers.
